Methodology

Research purpose:

To examine the use of expressions from the content world of mental health in the traditional media and social media

Research Metodology:

A representative sample from the Israeli media: printed, digital and broadcasted, and social media

Method of analysis:

Qualitative content analysis, which reliably reflects how the average Israeli perceives the coverage

Number of media reports: 2,680

Number of social media chats: 62,385

indicators:



Number of posts / chats



Number of appearances / reports

Analysis structure:

Expressions: insane, psychopath, mentally ill, schizophrenic, split personality

Usage classification: correct usage, incorrect usage, incorrect and offensive usage

Who used the expression: the media, politicians, celebrities, etc.

Terms & Findings

- ◆ As part of the research, we have analyzed reports and posts to examine in what context five selected expressions from the content world of mental health are used.
- ◆ We have classified the expression usage into 3 groups:
 1. **Correct usage:** To speak about a diagnosed mental condition. A very small part of the total usage

“The debtor has no earning capacity; he is a **mentally ill** individual, who hasn’t been working for 28 years.” (News1 website)

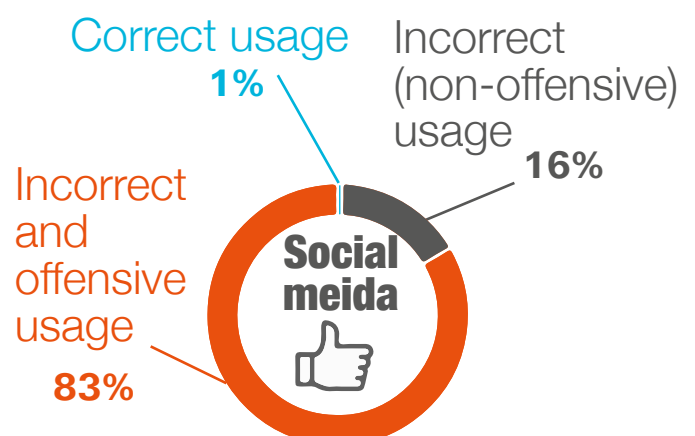
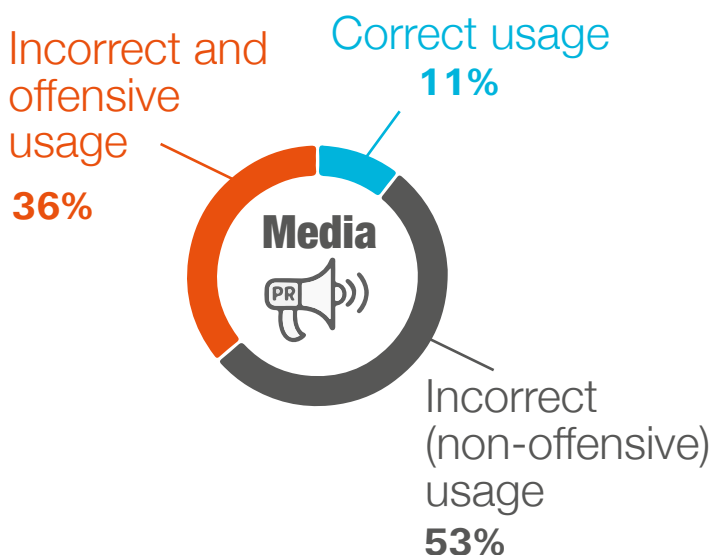
2. **Incorrect usage:** As adjectives that are common in language. Half of the expressions used in the media are used in this way.

I can see how competition over hi-tec workers has reached an insane level, and not only in terms of money (TheMarker Magazine)

3. **Incorrect and offensive:** When the expression is a way to say something negative. The absolute majority of the expressions used on the Internet.

“The man is mentally ill. He put the syringe he was vaccinated with in a frame!!!” (tweet)

The absolute majority of the incorrect usage of expressions in the social media is offensive | Correct, incorrect and offensive usage of expressions in the media and on the Internet

Incorrect usage of expressions

- ◆ In the media – the word “insane” is the most popular, in particular to describe big or extreme phenomena.
- ◆ On the social media – “mentally ill” has the highest usage and is only used in a derogatory sense.
- ◆ On the social media, too, the word insane is used to describe extreme phenomena and is the only word that is used non-offensively.
- ◆ Both in the media and on the social media, the words “mentally ill” and “psychopath” are used as derogatory terms.
- ◆ “Psychopath” is often used specifically to describe criminals – in reality and in popular culture.

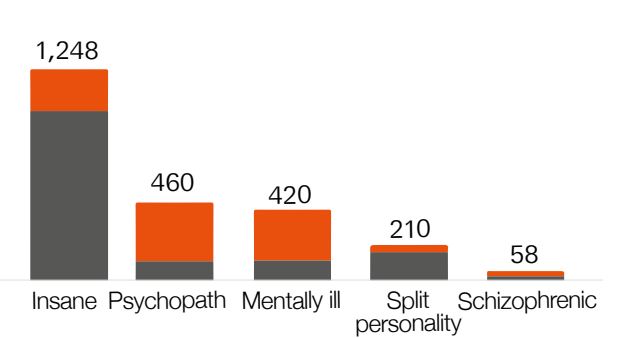
Insane is a common adjective, also in a positive sense

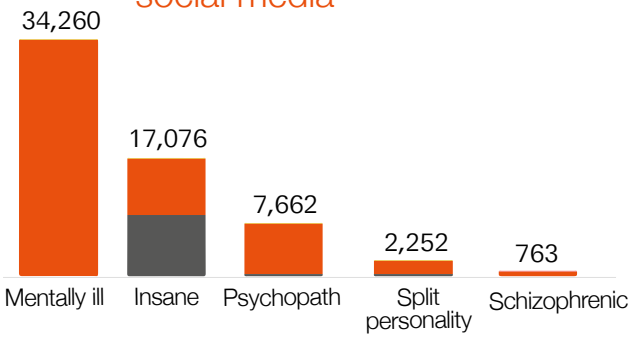

In the media – who used the expressions?

- ◆ The media (reporters, hosts, columns) is responsible for almost half of the incorrect usage of expressions. In most cases, the usage is non-offensive.
- ◆ Interestingly, the use of expressions is characteristic mainly of the printed media, often in opinion columns.
- ◆ Politicians use these expressions less, but when they do, it is usually in an offensive way.
- ◆ Examples that stand out in particular: Ulmert, who called Netanyahu mentally ill in an interview, and Aiman Odeh (KM), who called Itamar Ben Gvir (KM) mentally ill in a debate between the two.
- ◆ In general, discourse related to polarization and divisiveness serves as a catalyst to using these expressions – not only among politicians.

Politicians – use the expressions in an offensive way

A debate between Itamar Ben Gvir and Odeh, head of the Joint List: “Terrorist, mentally ill”

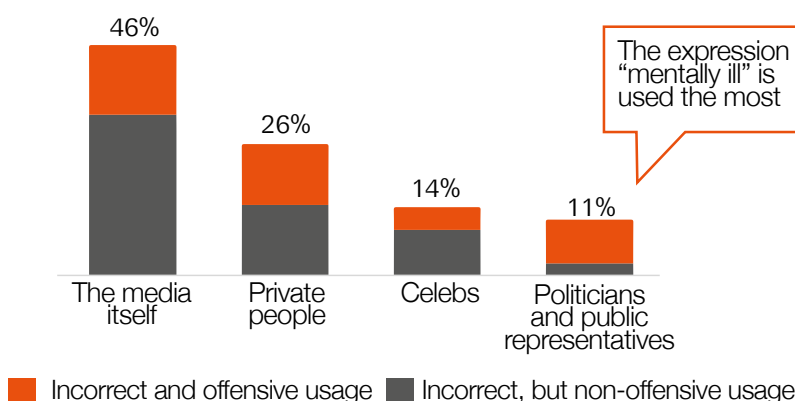
Dr. Michael Ben Ari snapped at the shocked host: “Tell me, are you insane?”

A severe case of split personality

Distribution by social media

- ◆ Most of the references are on Twitter, where the discourse is more jargon-like and focused on politics and COVID 19.
- ◆ This is an interesting finding, since in general, Twitter produces less chats than Facebook.
- ◆ offensive use of the expressions that were examined is related to divisive discourse, which is more pronounced in tweets.
- ◆ Most chats on the social media are offensive and Comments are the most offensive.



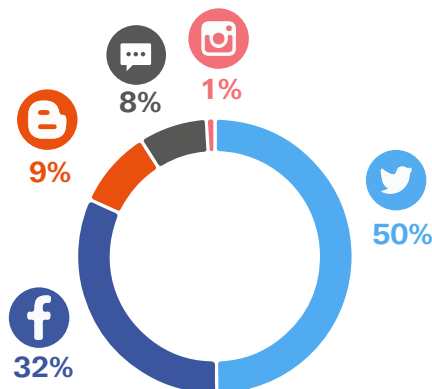

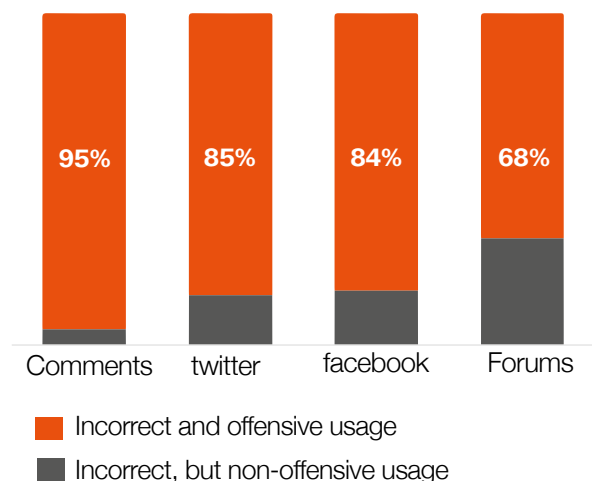

Changing the narrative

- ◆ The expressions come up as part of discussion about the correctness of their usage
- ◆ Note that sometimes in the media, too, a discussion takes place about the way these expressions are used (6% of all references in the social media).
- ◆ The subject comes up in particular after use is made of one of these expressions in an offensive way – and in response, criticism or legal actions take place.

Criticism of offensive use of an expression - politician

Ulmert demands a psychiatric examination for the Netanyahu family and defends himself: “mentally ill is not a derogatory term”

Knesset members – learn how to speak, hospitalization is not a curse word

Saar remarked sarcastically: “political schizophrenia”, the Knesset member attacked: “It’s a disease, not a derogatory term”

Legal actions as a result of expression use

Called her husband “psychopath” and will pay him 68 thousand Shekels compensation

...also sued the mayor and his close associates recently, for calling him “mentally ill” on several occasions.

Use of an expression towards LGBT community

Avoid expressing negative attitudes towards homosexuals at any age. Children can hear your remarks, such as **“mentally ill”** and the like.

When a student hears his friends use the word “homo” as a curse, when they say that **“they should be hospitalized in a hospital for the mentally ill”**, think what this does to a student, who has this experience in his life.
